



LIVESTOCK RISK PROTECTION (LRP) FEEDER CATTLE

The Livestock Risk Protection Insurance Plan for Feeder Cattle (LRP-Feeder Cattle) is designed to insure against declining market prices. Beef producers may choose from a variety of coverage levels and insurance periods that correspond with the time your feeder cattle would normally be marketed (ownership may be retained).

You may buy LRP-Feeder Cattle insurance throughout the year from a trusted ProAg approved livestock insurance agent. Premium rates, coverage prices and actual ending values are posted online daily. You may choose coverage prices ranging from 70 to 100 percent of the expected ending value. At the end of the insurance period, if the actual ending value is below the coverage price, you may receive an indemnity for the difference between the coverage price and actual ending value.

Availability

A Livestock Risk Protection insurance policy application must be submitted. Once accepted, it is considered a continuous policy.

The specific coverage endorsements are not continuous and are only effective for the period stated therein. You may buy specific coverage endorsements throughout the year for up to 3,000 head of feeder cattle that are expected to weigh up to 900 pounds at the end of the insurance period. The annual limit for LRP-Feeder Cattle is 6,000 head per producer per year (July 1 to June 30). All insured calves and cattle must be located in a state that is approved for LRP-Feeder Cattle at the time you buy an insurance policy.

The length of insurance coverage available for each specific coverage endorsement is 13, 17, 21, 26, 30, 34, 39, 43, 47 or 52 weeks.

Coverage is available for calves, steers, heifers, predominantly Brahman cattle and predominantly dairy cattle. You may also choose from two weight ranges – under 600 pounds and 600 – 900 pounds.

LRP-Feeder Cattle insurance is available in: Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin and Wyoming.

Buying a Policy

The LRP-Feeder Cattle program's coverage prices, rates, actual ending values and per hundredweight cost of insurance may be viewed on the RMA Web site at www.rma.usda.gov/tools/livestock.html. The actual ending values are based on weighted prices from USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service. Actual ending values are posted on the RMA's website at the end of the insurance period.

LRP coverage sales are typically offered every market trading day. These being in the afternoon, shortly after market close and run until approximately 9:00 a.m. CST the following morning.

LRP-Feeder Cattle insurance can be purchased through a ProAg certified livestock insurance agent. An application can be filled out at any time. However, insurance does not attach until you buy a specific coverage endorsement. You must pay the insurance premium the day you buy insurance coverage for coverage to start. You may buy multiple specific coverage endorsements with one application. Your insurance coverage starts the day you buy a specific coverage endorsement and RMA approves the purchase.

Premium Calculation Example:

An operation has 100 head of feeder cattle and expects to market the feeder cattle at a target weight of 7.5 cwt each. The insured share is 100 percent. The expected ending value is \$160.36 dollars per live cwt and the producer selects a coverage price of \$155 per live cwt. For this coverage price, the rate is 2.8019%. The premium subsidy is 20 percent. Premium subsidies range from 20-35% by coverage level. The premium is calculated by:

- › (1) 100 head times 7.5 cwt equals 750 cwt.
- › (2) 750 cwt times the coverage price of \$155 equals \$116,250.
- › (3) \$116,250 times the insured share of 1.00 equals an insured value of \$116,250.
- › (4) \$116,250 times the rate of .028019 equals \$3,257 total premium.
- › (5) \$3,257 times the producer premium subsidy percentage of .20 equals \$651.
- › (6) Subtracting \$651 from \$3,257 equals the producer premium of \$2,606



Indemnity Calculation Example:

For the above operation with 100 head of feeder cattle, a target weight of 7.5 cwt, an insured share of 100 percent and a coverage price of \$155 per live cwt, the actual ending value is equal to \$140 per live cwt. Since \$140 is less than the coverage price of \$155, an indemnity is due. Indemnity is calculated by:

- › (1) 100 head times the 7.5 cwt target weight equals 750 cwt.
- › (2) Subtracting the actual ending value of \$140 from the coverage price of \$155 equals \$15/cwt.
- › (3) Multiplying 750 cwt. by \$15/cwt. equals \$11,250.
- › (4) Multiplying \$11,250 by the insured share of 1.00 equals an indemnity payment of \$11,250
